HURRICANE SUPPLIES CHECKLIST

Here are some of the essential items that you will need to get through a hurricane and the aftermath. You should begin to collect supplies now to avoid the risk of stores running out of important items as a storm approaches. Please keep in mind as you are collecting supplies that you should **have enough of each item to last you 2 weeks!**



- Non-perishable food
- Drinking water
One gallon per person, per day
- Fuel
- Money
Most banks will be closed and ATM's will not be operational

- Extra prescription medications
Enough for one month
- Household bleach to purify water
- Tools
Hammer, nails, ax, crowbar, screwdriver, pliers, knife, etc...
- Specialty items for babies and elderly
- Duct tape and masking tape
- Flashlight
One for each member of your family with extra batteries
- Battery powered radio or TV with extra batteries
- Fire extinguisher
- Matches
- Charcoal or gas grill
- Sterno stove and extra fuel
- Disposable eating utensils



- Hand operated can opener
- Mosquito repellent
- First aid kit
- Garbage bags
- Rope
- Whistle or air horn



- Tarpaulin, canvas or 6-mil plastic sheeting
- Pet care items
- Cat litter
